







WHAT IS BANK DAY?

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- In 1991, the third Tuesday in March was declared Bank Day in Virginia by the Virginia General Assembly.
- Through this program, Virginia high school seniors learn about banking, financial services, and the vital role banks play in their communities.
- Bank Day is also our opportunity to expose young people to the merits of careers in banking.
- The students are required to write essays based on their experiences and college scholarships are awarded on the basis of the essays.



WHAT IS BANK DAY?


- This is the I4th year since the program was revived and reformatted in 2012.
- Since 2012, the Foundation has awarded \$296,000 in scholarships to 140 students.
- More than 650 students registered to participate at 29 banks for the 2024 program!



ESSAY TOPIC


Using what students learned during their Bank Day experiences, students will be asked to write essays on the following topic:


What did you learn during the Bank Day program that will help you manage your financial future AND what did you learn about how banks support their communities?



SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNTS

- In 2025, \$28,500 in college scholarships will be awarded by the Virginia Bankers Association Education Foundation to twelve students across the Commonwealth.
 - **Six** honorable mention winners, each winning a \$1,000 scholarship.
 - Six regional winners, each winning a \$2,500 scholarship.
 - NEW for 2025! One of the regional winners will be named the statewide runner-up winner, earning an extra \$2,500 scholarship for a total of \$5,000!
 - One of the regional winners will also be named the statewide winner, earning an extra \$5,000 scholarship for a total of \$7,500!





WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A BANK HOST?

YOUR ROLE IN THE 2025 PROGRAM

VBA ROLE VS. BANK ROLE

- Bank hosts will...
 - Using templates provided from the VBA,
 - Solicit student registrations through connections at local schools.
 - Send email reminders to registered students about program resource window;
 - Send email reminders to students about essay deadlines; and
 - Communicate with all registered students about access to the student resource webpage.
 - Host students ideally in person in March.
 - Provide supplemental resources to your specific list of registered students.

- The VBA will...
 - Provide resources, templates and support to bank hosts.
 - Collect student registrations and communicate registration lists/student contact information to host banks.
 - Communicate with all registered students in the weeks leading up to the program about access to the student resource webpage.
 - Create content for and provide access to student resource webpage.
 - Collect essays from students, coordinate judging and award scholarships.



BANK DAY GATHERINGS

- Banks will host a gathering ideally in person in March to provide an opportunity for students to meet with bankers, hear about ways your bank supports your community, meet the other students and ask questions.
- This is a great way to get your bank's senior leadership involved!
- If your bank hosts a virtual gathering, consider recording it to share with any students who were not able to attend "live"!
- Please note that student attendance at the gathering is required.



IDEAS FOR SUPPLEMENTAL RESOURCES

- Supplemental information should focus on ways your bank supports and engages with the community you serve. Examples include:
 - A contact at the bank who is available to answer any questions students may have while they are doing their research.
 - Pre-recorded messages from senior leadership.
 - Media mentions, articles, and/or press releases showing ways your bank has supported the local community.
 - Pictures and/or videos of bankers at community events.
 - Links to your bank's social media channels where community support and involvement is highlighted.



VBA STUDENT RESOURCE WEBPAGE

- VBA resources will cover a variety of banking industry topics, career opportunities in banking and ways banks support their communities. Sample content will include:
 - Scholarship amount information, program timeline and essay information
 - Recognition of bank hosts
 - Resources: Watch
 - A library of videos created by bankers from across the Commonwealth and the VBA staff
 - Resources: Read
 - Articles written by bankers, VBA staff, VBA Associate Members and industry experts
 - Resources: Listen
 - Podcasts and interviews from industry experts including ABA Banking Journal and the Federal Reserve



WHAT RESOURCES WILL THE BANK HOSTS RECEIVE?

- Email templates for school outreach to begin soliciting student registrations.
- Link to online student registration form.
- Bank Day one-page promotional flyer to share with schools.
- Essay guidelines and criteria to share with schools.
- Sample agendas for Bank Day gatherings.
- Ideas for supplemental resources for banks to send to students.
- Email templates to use as reminders as the program gets closer.





PROGRAM TIMELINE & NEXT STEPS

FOR BANK HOSTS AND STUDENTS

PROGRAM TIMELINE

December

Resources for bank hosts available from the VBA

January

 Student registration opens - bank hosts solicit student registrations

February

- Student registrations continue
- Bank hosts remind schools about the program
- Bank hosts work on plans for gatherings and any supplemental resources they will provide
- February 28th student registration deadline*

March

 Banks host gatherings for students and send supplemental resources to registered students

March continued

- March 3rd students receive program details from the VBA and access to resource webpage from the VBA
- March 28th Bank Day resource window closes; students essays due to VBA by 5:00 p.m.

April

 By the end of April – Honorable Mention and Regional winners announced

May

By May 2nd – Statewide Runner-Up and Statewide winner announced

*Deadline is flexible for banks hosting later in March.



NEXT STEPS FOR BANK HOSTS & STUDENTS

Bank Hosts

- Complete the bank interest form on the VBA website.
- Explore the resources and templates from the VBA. Determine who at your bank will lead the bank's efforts with this program.
- Begin discussions about what supplemental resources your bank would like to provide.
- Begin outreach to local schools to solicit student registrations.
- Be on the lookout for communications from the VBA!

Students

- Learn about the opportunity through their school guidance department or scholarship coordinator.
- Officially register with the VBA (beginning in January).
- Receive program details from bank hosts in late February/early March.
- Receive communication from the VBA about the program and access to the VBA resource webpage the week of March 3rd.
- Receive access to any supplemental information from bank hosts in March.
